Program Specifics:

- Fellows will commit to one academic year in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District
 - Fellows are encouraged to create deeper relationships with students, teachers and administrations beyond the required hours (potentially eliminating need for outside employment)
 - Become involved outside of the classroom by taking advantage of opportunities at the school PD sessions, extracurricular activities, groups, etc.
 - Placements may be year-long or split between two schools, depending on licensure requirements
- Fellows will attend several program meetings through the year
- Fellows will participate in professional development sessions each semester (excused absences)
- Fellows may receive up to \$6,300 over the course of 2018-2019 in six payments to be awarded after the 15th of each of the following months: October, December, February, March, April, May). This will be awarded as a grant (not to affect Financial Aid) and received as a reimbursement check/deposit. *Payments will be awarded after hours are completed and timesheets submitted.
