VIII. Degree Status

You will be admitted as a degree-seeking graduate student if you meet the grade point average entrance requirements as specified by the Graduate College (see CSU Graduate College admission requirements). A degree-seeking student must have a 3.0 final GPA. If you do not meet the grade point average entrance requirements, you can either take the GRE or the MAT and earn a qualifying score or be admitted as a non-degree seeking student for Summer 1, complete all summer courses with the grade of B or better, and then apply for degree-seeking admission for the fall semester.
