ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants to the Master of Urban Planning and Development program must meet the minimum requirements established by the College of Graduate Studies and the MUPD program faculty:

- + A strong undergraduate academic record as evidenced by a GPA of 3.0 or above
- + Quantitative, verbal, and analytical skills through strong GRE scores or alternative evidence
- + A commitment to improving neighborhoods, cities, and regions
